Minutes

Ed Geus made a motion to accept the minutes from the June 4, 2018 meeting. JB DosSantos seconded and the motion carried.

Old Business

North Main Street Corridor

Making Collins a one-way street has been officially ruled out as a possibility. Many of the issues with this corridor were addressed by the Committee during the Hamlet Studies. The EH/Sag Harbor CAC should be receiving updated versions of the Hamlet Studies, which include the Committee's comments. Current proposals would eliminate left turn from southbound Three Mile Harbor onto Springs Fireplace. Access to Springs Fireplace from Three Mile Harbor will be via Jackson Avenue. New road striping will force northbound traffic from North Main to commit to Springs Fireplace much earlier. The committee briefly discussed consistent traffic infractions (wrong way drivers) on Jackson/Floyd St.

The Committee continues to believe that the traffic on Cedar St in front of the Emergencies Services Building is poorly defined and presents a serious safety risk to pedestrians and Emergency Services vehicles and personnel. Peter Van Scoyoc stressed that any plan to better define the intersection should include input from the Highway Dept., Emergency Services, Fire Dept. and the Town Engineer.

A motion was made to draft a letter to the Town Board with cc to Highway Dept., Town Engineer & Emergency Services to make traffic calming improvements to the intersection of Cedar and North Main with clearly defined lanes, cross-hatching, bump-outs and pedestrian “refuge/median” in the middle of the street across Cedar. Motion carried.

New Business

Maple Lane

The temporary “No Parking” signs that were put up last summer on Maple Lane to maintain a clear lane within 30ft of the stop signs worked relatively well. However the signs have not been maintained and issue has recurred this summer, mostly on the weekends. There has been little to no enforcement activity. At a minimum the signs need to be “reinstalled” and we need to step up enforcement activity. It was suggested that permanent signs would be more effective and not require maintenance. Peter Van Scoyoc agreed to follow up on the sign and enforcement issues with the appropriate agencies.

Town Lane/Accabonac/Floyd

Another car accident occurred the previous weekend. The intersection is very confusing. The area needs traffic calming measures and a redesign of the road markings. Lowering the speed limit is not an option as the Town is barred from lowering speed limits below 30mph. A letter was previously written about this intersection and Peter Van Scoyoc agreed to raise the issue at the next Town Board meeting.

The Dunes

ZBA hearing is scheduled for July 17th at 7:30pm.

Old Town Records

There has been an effort to move old records from the old Town Hall building. The archaic and ancient records have been removed some time ago and entrusted to East Hampton Library Long Island Collection. All other town records have also been removed. Many are not required to be retained and will be destroyed. Others will be digitized in 2 forms for back-up and easy retrieval and the physical paper will be destroyed.
