Minutes of the 8/6/2018 Meeting of the EH/Sag Harbor CAC

In attendance: Ed Geus, Jola Marcario, Arline Gidion, Mary Ella Moeller, JB Dos Santos, Prudence Carabine, Bob Brody, Katy Casey & liaison Peter Van Scoyoc.

Minutes of the previous meeting were ACCEPTED.

Presenter

Gordian Raacke presented on the town's renewable energy initiative to meet the east end's needs and work toward 100% energy self sufficiency by 2030. South Fork Peak Savers Program and Energize East Hampton were detailed, presentation is made part of these Minutes.

New Members

Bob Brody was asked to be a member of the committee, he accepted.

Minute Taker

Arline Gideon agreed to be the Minuter Taker going forward now that Anthony is no longer a member of this committee as he has moved to Wainscott. The chair on behalf of the committee is grateful to Anthony Liberatore for so diligently documenting our meetings in the poast. We appreciate his good work and wish im well on the Wainscott CAC.

Old Business

Cedar Street – North Main Street Corridor was discussed at a meeting with County Legislator Bridget Fleming, two town board members Sylvia Overby and Kathee Burke-Gonzalez, the County chief engineer Bill Hillman, MKMcLean Assoc. Paul McMahan, and community members including EH/Sag Harbor and Springs CAC representatives. The county outlined the project, showed maps, gave a timeline for completion, and identified 3 priorities to be addressed. They will be resurfacing and striping, and adding sidewalks. No formal bike lanes are included in the project at this time. The CR40 – CR41 fork (Three Mile & Springs Fireplace) is not on the county schedule for now, and they have agreed to allow the town to make striping to eliminate the left turn and make the intersection safer.

Maple Lane –

During the week it is pretty good but on weekends there are still people parking where they should not, on the private road. The signs are still up but the police should patrol between 5-7PM.

The county bus route is being adjusted and has caused the enter/exit to be switched at the EH Medical Center so the buses can drop riders at the front door.

Floyd Street & Town Lane at Accabonac – the supervisor will consult the police chief and town engineer to get crash data and see if improvements can be made to make it safer. There was another accident there today. Also, vehicles continue to go the wrong way on Floyd to Springs Fireplace. Supervisor is waiting to hear back from the PD. They also spoke about Jenny's Path and Queens Lane crossing Accabonac which is a blind spot.

Announcements

This Saturday there will be 15 – 18 antique tractors parading to the EH Historical Farm Museum. Lester and Talmage families will be represented. The Long Island Power Association organized the event.

Maureen's Haven will be restarting this fall.

New phone scams are using local phone numbers somehow. The Caller ID and number are familiar but it's a robo call.

The recent raid on the overcrowded house on Railroad Avenue is symptomatic of the housing crisis and limited availability of affordable rentals. It is effecting employers' ability to attract workers. The town put out an RFP for seasonal housing in Montauk and there was not 1 single response. Zone changes have been proposed to creating opportunities in Central Business Districts to increase density to allow double occupancy (up to 8 unrelated adults in one SFR). A letter was sent to every property owner in Montauk reminding them about the Border Renter law and there was no interest.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:50.
