East Hampton Airport Seasonal Air Traffic Control Tower Final Environmental Assessment and FONSI/ROD

The Town of East Hampton (Airport Sponsor) is proposing the permanent installation of an Air Traffic Control Tower (ATCT) that will be operational on a seasonal basis at East Hampton Airport (HTO). The "season" is generally defined as the month of May to the month of September each year. The Airport is located in the Town of East Hampton in Suffolk County, New York.

In conformance with the provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act, the Airport has prepared an Environmental Assessment (EA). After careful consideration of the information contained in the Final EA, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has determined that significant environmental effects will not result from the proposed action. Therefore, the FAA has issued a Finding of No Significant Impact/Record of Decision (FONSI/ROD). FAA arrived at these determinations by considering public and agency comments received on the Draft EA during the comment period of April 2, 2013 to May 13, 2013, and reviewing the environmental analysis in the Final EA and all other relevant documents that comprise the EA record.

The EA and FONSI/ROD is available for public review at East Hampton Airport from June 14, 2013 until July 13, 2013. The Airport is located at 200 Daniels Hole Road, Wainscott, NY.
