Jezebel & Lillac on Cedar Street was acquired by the Town Board for farmer housing only. Carla inquired into what is happening to the structures existing on the property. The structures could be used for storage of equipment. Kathee will research.

Quality of life issues such as smoking on the beach, traffic, etc. are being brought up at Town Hall meetings. Jola brought up quality of life issues taken up by existing Town committees' special events code (such as parties). Councilman Lys suggested a smoking ban up to 500 feet from the lifeguard stations and in parking lots and comfort stations.

Steve Lynch, Highway Superintendent, made a presentation to the Town Board about a temporary "test" for a rotary at Cedar Street, Old NW Road and Stephen Hands Path using detour signs.

Discussions of a roundabout at Two Holes of Water and Stephen Hands Path has been ok'd with the engineer. Jerry stated that trees need to be trimmed at Old Northwest Road and Stephen Hands Path as views are obstructed. Chief Sarlo is opposed to changing anything to one-way at this location as he is worried about head-on collisions with the change of traffic patterns on the roads. Kathee stated that the fog lines in this area have not yet been painted should traffic become one-way.
