Old Business:

(Hardscrabble) Stephen Hands Path – Cedar Street – Old Northwest improvements – LKMclean Assoc has been retained by the Town using bond revenues to engineer a round-about at the bottom of Two Holes of Water and install drainage. No funds have been budgeted or allocated to re-engineer Stephen Hands Path and Cedar Street intersection.

Interns to scan for illegal rentals – There are not many interns at town hall but code enforcement is coordinating efforts to crack down on problem properties.

New Business

Next Adopt-a-Hwy pick up - scheduled for June 11 at 9:00AM, meet at the senior center

Increased traffic on West Drive and Signage - topics were tabled until next meeting

All Hands on Housing Kathee gave an overview of town board initiatives and encouraged committee members to watch the presentation at the upcoming June 7 work session. A working group will be convening on June 8 to begin work on the Community Housing Fund Plan.

New senior center community engagement - turnout was high Wednesday and Saturday, Sunday was lightly attended. There was a lot of worthwhile feedback and the architects were very responsive and receptive to public input.

Dangerous dog attacks – a letter from the Settler's Landing HOA was read at the meeting regarding 5 reported dog attacks by a pack (4 or 5) of dogs in the vicinity of Woodpinck, High Point, and Ely Brook. In one instance a babysitter sustained serious injuries when they had to defend an infant that the animals were trying to steal away from the stroller. The animals are owned by Taylor Herman. Several complaints have been filed with the town against the animals' owner, Taylor Herman, but no action has been taken to remove or control the animals as far as the association is aware. The HOA is asking for the CAC's help in getting relief from these dangerous animals.
