PREPAREDNESS TIPS

Make sure you have a preparedness kit. For items to include, visit the Suffolk County Office of Emergency Management website:

www.suffolkcountyny.gov



- ✓ Develop a storm plan for your family and pets.
- ✓ Monitor local media and weather reports ahead of time.
- ✓ Check the Suffolk County storm surge and shelter map. (See Other Resources)
- ✓ Obey local emergency orders. **EVACUATE IN A TIMELY FASHION IF YOU ARE TOLD TO DO SO.**
- ✓ Know the flood evacuation routes, public shelters, and where to find high ground.
- ✓ Have a 10-14 day supply of medications and other essential health-related items on hand for you and your pets.
- ✓ Be prepared to lose power; purchase a supply of batteries ahead of time.
- ✓ Stock up on a 10-14 day supply of food, water (one gallon per person per day), and hygiene items before the storm strikes.
- ✓ A battery powered or wind-up radio are important safety tools.
- ✓ Test sump pumps and, if possible, have a backup power source.
- ✓ Fill up all of your vehicles with gasoline ahead of time. Have several full containers of propane and gasoline on hand.
- ✓ If your basement floods, minimize damage by elevating materials that could be damaged.
- ✓ Contact friends and family so that everyone knows where you are and where you plan to go.
- ✓ Charge your cell phone ahead of time and have car cellphone charger if possible.
- ✓ Have at least \$300 in cash on hand; ATM machines need electric to work.
- ✓ Have copies of your important papers (birth certificate, insurance policies) in your preparedness kit.

SHELTERS

PET NEEDS

If you are forced to evacuate and you have a pet, it is always advisable to bring the pet with you if you can. You should never leave your pet behind. Have a 10-14 day supply of food, water, and medications for your pets.



In preparation for an evacuation, have a "Pet Emergency Go Bag" ready to take with you and your pet. Details of what should be in the Pet Emergency Go Bag are available at: www.arfhamptons.org

All pets should be microchipped before an emergency arises. Contact ARF to learn about their free microchipping program.

If it is impossible to bring your pet with you, cats and dogs can be sheltered at two Pet Emergency Evacuation Centers in East Hampton Town. If you live in Montauk, you can bring your pet to the **Montauk Playhouse** at 240 Edgemere Street.

If you live anywhere else in the town, you can bring your pet to the **Animal Rescue Fund of the Hamptons** (ARF) Adoption Center at 90 Daniels Hole Road in Wainscott. ARF is located right next to the East Hampton Airport.

Your pet can be boarded at either of these facilities free of charge for the duration of the emergency evacuation.

If you are bringing your pet to ARF, please try to call in advance at 631-537-0400.

You should be able to provide proof that your pet is up to date on vaccinations and have any special medications ready.

All cats and dogs should have a collar with identification tags. You will be asked to fill out a short intake form and release.
