



RESOLUTION 2010-209

Climate Smart Community Pledge

WHEREAS, the Town of East Hampton believes that climate change poses a real and increasing threat to our local and global environments and that it is primarily due to the burning of fossil fuels; and

WHEREAS, we believe that climate change may endanger our economy and livelihoods, harm our farms, orchards, forests and fisheries, spread invasive species and exotic diseases, reduce drinking water supplies and pose health threats to our citizens; and

WHEREAS, we believe that our response to climate change provides us with an unprecedented opportunity to save money, build livable, energy-independent and secure communities, vibrant innovation economies, healthy and safe schools and resilient infrastructures; and

WHEREAS, we believe the scale of greenhouse gas emissions reductions required for climate stabilization will require sustained and substantial efforts; and

WHEREAS, we believe that even were emissions dramatically reduced today, communities would still be required to adapt to the effects of climate change for decades to come; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of East Hampton pledges to pursue the following measures in order to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and adapt to a changing climate:

1. Pledge to combat climate change;
2. Inventory emissions, set goals and move to action;
3. Decrease the energy demand in municipal operations;
4. Encourage renewable energy;
5. Realize the benefits of recycling;
6. Integrate climate protection into community planning;
7. Support a green innovation economy;
8. Inform and inspire the public;
9. Evaluate risks and plan for adaption; and
10. Commit to an evolving process paralleling current research and policy.
